### **American Indian Endowed Scholarship**

This program was created by the 1990 Washington State Legislature to provide opportunities for American Indian students to obtain a higher education. Scholarships are awarded to financially needy Washington residents with close social and cultural ties to an American Indian tribe and/or American Indian community in this state. Ten to fourteen students receive the scholarship annually. Awards are up to \$1,000 for one academic year.
